Why should I attend?

If you are looking for a summer internship, or for full-time employment, then this is a great opportunity to interview with several companies at one place and one time. On Saturday September 25, Dan Tearpock will present an all day workshop "**Workshop #1 - Quality Control for Subsurface Maps**" which can include up to 24 students. On Saturday evening, there will be a reception, poster session and networking opportunity. On Sunday, September 26, students will have the chance to meet with company representatives. Companies will review submitted resumes, poster abstracts and posters, and select individuals for scheduled interviews on Sunday. Prizes totaling \$850 will be awarded for Best Posters (see below).

How Do I Attend?

By September 4, 2009:

- 1) Register on the main meeting form (see form - visit <http://www.aapgesmeeting2010.mbg.org>)
- 2) Be sure to mark the box on the registration form for the Student Job Quest
- 3) Submit your resume (8.5" x 11" page in electronic file format (doc or pdf) to Lee Avary.
There is a 2 page maximum.
- 4) Submit a one-page, 250 word, abstract if entering the poster contest (see abstract guidelines on the AAPG meeting "Call for Papers" link on the website for suggested format). You are not required to present a poster; however this is an excellent opportunity to showcase yourself and your work for prospective employers!

- Resumes and abstracts will be forwarded to participating companies by Lee Avery before the Student Job Quest, so tentative interview schedules can be set up.
- Poster Competition: One 4 x 8 ft display on any personal geological research topic
(This is not just for petroleum topics)
- Prizes of \$500, \$250, and \$100 will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places, respectively.
- An abstract book of student submissions will be provided to each participant free of charge.

How Much Does it Cost?

The convention registration fee for students is \$25, which covers BOTH the general Eastern Section AAPG meeting and the Student Job Quest. This fee will be waived for students who volunteer to help with the meeting on Monday or Tuesday. The workshop costs an extra \$10 for students and \$25 for faculty members. The workshop is limited to 24 students and 4 faculty members. Sign up on the ES-AAPG meeting registration form
